Last week hand sanitizers were installed in every classroom throughout the school. Students and staff are reminded that one of the most effective ways to minimize the spread of the H1N1 virus is to wash their hands on a regular basis. COLLEGE INFORMATION FAIR

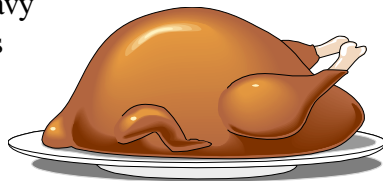

40 HOURS COMMUNITY SERVICE

A reminder that all students must complete 40 hours of community service prior to graduation. Student services will visit Grade 9 classes during October to explain this requirement. SPECIALIST HIGH SKILLS MAJOR

The **Specialist High Skills Major in Health and Wellness** at Sacred Heart has 3 different focuses: Fitness, Health Care, and Child Care and Family Services. These areas of focus suit a variety of career pathways. Students who sign up for the SHSM in grade 10 or 11 will receive certifications such as CPR, First Aid, WHIMIS, and infection control. They will receive opportunities for experiential learning. See Student Services for more details.

SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

The following Sacred Heart graduates were awarded 2009-2010 Queen Elizabeth II Aiming for the Top Scholarships: Patrick Cantlon, Stephen James, Greg Kroeplin, Matthew Lehman, Ami Ng, Katie Rehkopf, Alex Reinhart, Amberley Ruetz and Hilory Von Hatten-Baer. The Queen Elizabeth II Aiming for the Top Scholarship Program is a program of the Ontario Government that rewards students who graduate with top marks at their high school, and who plan to continue their studies at an Ontario college or university. Students who maintain an 80% average at the postsecondary level can receive these scholarships, which are worth up to a maximum of \$3500 per year, for up to four years in total.

EQAO RESULTS

Individual results from the 2008-2009 EQAO Grade 9 Math Testing were mailed home earlier this week. Our students performed well on the testing. A summary of our school results are outlined in the charts below:

DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM AT SHHS

Sacred Heart High School will be hosting a dual credit course starting in February. Dual credits give high school students the opportunity to sample college and earn a credit that counts both toward their high school and college diplomas. The course will run one evening a week (3 hours each night) for 14 weeks beginning in February. The college course that will be offered at our school is called, "Social Impact of Technology, General Education". TRANSPORTING EQUIPMENT ON SCHOOL BUSES

- Musical Instruments**
 May be transported in cases only and shall be kept on the student's lap.
- Skates**
 All skates transported shall have the blades suitably protected with guards and shall be tied together or be in a suitable equipment bag. The skates shall be placed on the floor at the student's feet.
- Hockey Equipment**
 Hockey sticks may only be transported with the approval of the school Principal and Bus Operator. Hockey equipment **may not** be transported on a school bus on a home to school route. On a charter basis, hockey equipment may be transported if it is stored in the storage space underneath the bus or inside, provided it does not block any exits or the aisle of the bus.
- Skis, Poles & Snowboards**
May not be transported on a school bus on a home to school route.
- Skateboards**
May not be transported on a school bus.
- Laser Pointers**
May not be transported on a school bus.
- Animals**
May not be transported on a school bus.
