During the upcoming holiday season we encourage everyone to take time to reflect on the true meaning of Christmas.

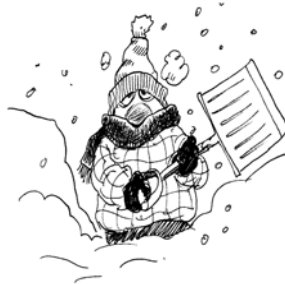

INCLEMENT WEATHER PLANS - What will you do if your bus is stranded in Walkerton?

Students and parents are encouraged to develop contingency plans in the event that school buses get stranded in Walkerton at the end of the day due to inclement weather. Do you have a relative or friend in Walkerton that can take you in for the night if your bus is unable to leave Walkerton? Over the past number of years we have had a few occasions when some buses were unable to leave Walkerton due to road closures. THE ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST (OSSLT)

Students who are in Grade 10 (and those who did not successfully complete the test in previous years) will be writing the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test on April 2nd, 2009. Students should be preparing in advance to ensure that they are successful on the test. Sample preparation materials/questions from previous tests can be found on the EQAO Web Site at <http://www.eqao.com>. Students should check out the type of questions that they will face on the test and practice such question types so that there are no surprises on the test. Successfully completing the Literacy Requirement is mandatory to receive your Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

ARE YOU GRADUATING THIS YEAR?

Checklist for students planning to graduate this year:

- ➔ Make sure that your name is on the graduation list - Check with Mrs. Mount
- ➔ Make sure that you have completed your 40 hours of Community Service and handed in all of the paperwork to Mrs. Stuempfle in the guidance office.
- ➔ Make sure that you will have 30 credits by the end of June
- ➔ Make sure that you have or will complete all the compulsory (required) credits for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma
- ➔ Make sure that you have written and passed the Literacy Test or that you have or will have successfully completed the Literacy Course by the end of June

Alcohol and Other Drugs: Prevention and Intervention

Role as Parents:

Role Model - One of the best ways to teach your children is through your own example.

How do I use alcohol? What is this modeling telling my teen? What do I want to change, if anything, to be a better role model?

Teens in Grey and Bruce Counties have stated that families influence their behaviour. Only after grade 10 (about age 15) does parental influence tend to be taken over by peers. That leaves a huge 'window of opportunity' for parents. During this time, they can work on influencing their children in positive ways and teaching them their values.

Educator - Parents need to know the facts and teach them in a caring way. When parents do not feel that they know enough to speak about a type of drug or issue, they need to be honest about it and find out the correct answer, either alone or with their child.

Rule/Limit Setter - The laws regarding the use of alcohol and other drugs are very specific. Parents need to teach these rules, and support them by establishing a clear and consistent 'no use' rule in their families. Example:

*"We agree that for the health and safety of our family no one in the family will use illegal drugs, and there will be no use of alcohol or nicotine by minors."**

*Put measures in place to deal with rule breaking. One example is a 'Family Contract'. This is a written or verbal agreement between the teen and the parent(s) that if the teen is in a situation where drinking or other drug use is involved, they can call their parent(s) and the parent(s) will pick them up. There would be no questions asked at the time. The next day is when the discussion needs to take place. Parents need to remind their teen about the previously discussed family rules. They also need to discuss what the consequences are for breaking them.

Stimulator of Health Activity - Encourage "challenging" activities that have positive effects. Plan 'family fun nights' often. Be interested and involved in your child's hobbies.

Consultant/Educator on Peer Pressure - Building high self-esteem leads to your child having courage. Courage to make their own decisions and courage to stand up to peer pressure. Teach and practice 'resistance skills' with your children (one way to do that is through role-play).

Monitor/Supervisor - According to Grey Bruce Parent Norms Survey Study Results (2002), when teens are not at home, the majority of parents know where their teens are, who they are with, and whether or not they come home on time. "Research clearly shows that good parental supervision is a key factor in preventing delinquency drug use and school failure" (Active Parenting of Teens, p.150) Knowing where our children are, who they are with, setting reasonable curfews, and being awake when teens come home are important.

Identifier and Confronter of Drug Use - the result of the Grey Bruce Parent Norms Survey (2002) showed that an overwhelming majority of parents in Grey and Bruce Counties are 'extremely concerned' about regular alcohol, marijuana and tobacco use by youth. The earlier a drug problem is found and faced, the less difficult it is to overcome.

Signs of potential problem:

- * Change in moods, angry, upset or secretive
- * Becoming more distant from the family
- * Sudden changes in sleeping or eating habits
- * Spends a lot of time with a new group of friends that you do not know
- * Forgets easily, can't think fast or concentrate
- * Sudden drop in grades
- * Sudden change in appearance
- * Money or things missing from home
- * Posters and T-shirts that promote using
- * Loss of interest in hobbies that had been important to them
- * Possession of drug-related paraphernalia
- * Possession of drugs themselves or evidence of drug
- * Odour of alcohol and other drugs, or cover-up smells

How to deal with the issue:

- * Confront when the teen is sober
- * If you have a partner plan a 'united front'
- * Plan the discussion ahead of time...your goals and consequences



- * Have the discussion when you can be calm, firm and caring
- * Use discipline techniques...I messages and consequences (e.g. "We're doing this because we care about you.")

Networker - Parents need to talk with other parents. Know what other parents are doing. Create a 'parent network'. There is strength in numbers. The Grey Bruce Parent Norms Survey Study Results (2002) showed the parents in Grey Bruce have a strong need and desire to talk with one another. Parents need to know that they are not alone in their decisions about family rules. Parents need to know that they are not alone in their struggles to prevent teen alcohol and other drug use.

Manager of Own Feelings - Parents need to manage their own feelings. Confront the problem and your teen in a calm, yet firm manner. Remember: Parents influence. They do not control. Your teen's choices do not make you a bad parent.

HOW TO SAY 'NO' AND NOT LOOK LIKE A 'JERK'

- * Ask questions
- * Name the trouble
- * Identify the consequences
- * Suggest an alternative
- * Talk, walk the talk, and leave the door open

Senior Boys Hockey

The senior boys hockey team began their 2008-09 hockey season in October with a 6-3 exhibition game victory over the visiting Norwell Redmen of Palmerston. This was followed by the Crusader Classic Tournament hosted by Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Secondary of Guelph November 14 - 15. Sacred Heart finished first overall in Elite Division play on the strength of victories over Orangeville District Secondary, Norwell and the host Lourdes team in round robin play. The Crusaders ran into penalty trouble in the championship game, playing shorthanded for 36 minutes in the 32-minute game, and ended up on the wrong side of a 2-1 score. Sacred Heart surrendered two power play goals in the contest.

The BAA season opener saw Sacred Heart defeat their cross-town rivals Walkerton District by score of 6-1.

In the Norwell Redmen Tournament November 29, Sacred Heart tied Centre Wellington of Fergus and JF Ross of Guelph 4-4 both games. They defeated Oakridge Secondary of London 3-1 to finish second in their pool on "A" side of the tournament. In championship quarterfinal action, the Crusaders defeated Centre Wellington 2-0, before losing a tight contest to Bluevale Collegiate of Waterloo, 2-1 in the championship semi-final.

Coaches Orr, Hambrook and Ward are hoping the senior boys can successfully defend their 2008 BAA and CWOSSA championship titles.
