Crusaders win silver medal at OFSAA rugby tournament

Sacred Heart High School earned a silver medal the Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association (OFSAA) "A/AA" girls rugby tournament last week. The local Crusaders played for the gold medal last Wednesday against the topseeded team at the provincial event, Bayside Secondary School, of Belleville. Bayside won the game 22-5, with the lone SHHS try scored by Krystal Wyatt.

It was fitting for the Crusaders to finish as silver medalists, given that the team was seeded second going into the tournament.

Held at Mentor College in Mississauga, the OFSAA championships featured four pools of teams. Playing in Pool 'B', SHHS won four games in a row before suffering the loss to Bayside.

In game one June 4, the Crusaders defeated the sixth seed, Westlane Secondary School, of Niagara Falls, 8-0 on a try by inside centre Stephanie Doerr and a penalty kick by fullback Kaitlyn Benninger.

Later that day, SHHS got past Orillia's Park Street Collegiate Institute 17-3 on tries by Benninger, standoff Brandy Zettler and Doerr. Benninger also kicked a convert in that game.

In action June 5, SHHS took on the host Mentor College squad, of Mississauga, in the quarter-finals and duplicated the 17-3 victory over Park Street. Doerr scored two tries for the Crusaders while Benninger added one try and one convert.

The quarter-final win boosted SHHS into one of two championship semi-finals last Tuesday afternoon. The Crusaders beat Brock High School, of Cannington, which was seeded third, by a narrow 7-5 margin. Doerr scored the try and Benninger earned the convert.

The other semifinal game, Bayside went up against the unseeded Opeongo High School, of Douglas. (Opeongo came into tournament with 16-1 record.) Bayside won the game 20-0 to advance to the championship final against SHHS.

In the bronze medal game, Opeongo defeated Brock 11-8 to claim third place.

On Thursday May 24th, the Crusaders won CWOSSA for the 2nd time in three years. In the morning match the Crusaders defeated Wellington Center 2-0. Spencer Ruetz and Cody Anderson tallied for the Heart. In the championship game, the Crusaders beat Saugeen District 1-0. The lone tally went to Ethan Mount. As a result, the team qualified for the All Ontario "AA" championship held in Timmins June 4th to 6th.

In order to reach the quarter finals the Crusaders needed to place 1st or 2nd in their pool.

The Crusaders played four games winning two games and tying two others. On the first day, the Crusaders tied St Mary's of Brockville 0-0. In the afternoon, the team beat Timmins High School 2-0. Rob Eckensweiler and Cody Rice scored for the Heart. The weather conditions were brutal. The rain made the field a quagmire. The cold and blowing winds added to the treacherous conditions.

On the following day, Sacred Heart played number two ranked St Paul's of Mississauga to a one all draw. Mark McDonald scored on a pretty set up by Rob Eckensweiler. Later in the day, the Crusaders defeated eighth ranked St Christopher's of Sarnia 2-0. Spencer Ruetz and Rob Eckensweiler scored for the Heart. As a result of the victory, the Heart ended up first in their pool.

In the quarter finals, Sacred Heart had to play the number one ranked Governor Simcoe of St Catherines. The first half ended in a 0-0 draw with Vince Weber making an outstanding save to keep the match tied. Unfortunately, Governor Simcoe scored with 15 minutes left in the game. The Heart continued to press missing a crucial opportunity to tie. Governor Simcoe scored again with seconds remaining.

Although deeply disappointed in the final result, the Crusaders could take consolation in the fact that Governor Simcoe eventually won the gold metal.
